Parish Center Completed at Incarnation

Incarnation Church, in Ewing, recently opened its new Parish Center with a Dedication Mass celebrated by The Most Reverend John M. Smith, Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, Incarnation's Pastor Monsignor Hugh Ronan and other clergy.

The new 11,300 square-foot addition to the church's school, constructed by Scozzari Builders, includes a gymnasium, additional classrooms, rest rooms and locker facilities. A new elevator was installed to connect the school to the gymnasium. Outside the Parish Center, Scozzari Builders installed a new parking lot and detailed landscaping. Scozzari's offices are located at 1891 N. Olden Ave., across the street from the new Incarnation Parish Center.

"Safety takes on an entirely new significance when building a structure where many children will be present on a daily basis," said Nicholas Scozzari, Vice President at Scozzari Builders, Inc. "Our long experience in educational building has given us an intuitive insight into the special needs of those facilities."
